

Anti-Bullying Policy - Pupil Friendly

Introduction

- Bullying of any kind is unacceptable.
- Tell someone if you see bullying or are being bullied.



Any of the actions below, which happen repeatedly could be considered bullying :

- name calling
- teasing
- mocking
- insulting
- making offensive comments
- physical assault e.g. hitting, kicking, spitting
- taking or damaging belongings
- posting rude messages on social media and sending mean texts
- gossiping and spreading hurtful rumours
- repeatedly ignoring others

What to do if you are being bullied

- Tell an adult, this could be a teacher, TA or your parents.
- All reports of bullying will be investigated by the head teacher Beaky Heaton.

What happens when bullying is reported in school

Stage 1

We all meet together to talk about what has happened and how that made everyone feel. We will think of a way to stop this happening again. We will let parents know that we are meeting together.

Stage 2

If the bullying still carries on we will meet with parents and ask them to make sure that the bullying does not happen again. We will write everything down.

Stage 3

If the bullying is still happening there will be a serious consequence for the person doing the bullying.

The ways we can stop bullying in school

- Have opportunities in PSHE lessons to learn about internet safety
- Be encouraged to recognise and accept differences between each other
